



CORVETTE CLASSES AND ADDITIONAL CATEGORIES FOR FUN SHOWS

- I. Corvette Classes.
 - A. Corvettes are generally identified by their series (C1- C6), and the Club uses these as the basis for establishing show classes. All Corvette show vehicles will be assigned to one of these classes:
 - C1 - 1953 to 1962
 - C2 - 1963 to 1967
 - C3 - 1968 to 1982
 - C4 - 1984 to 1996
 - C5 - 1997 to 2004
 - C6 - 2005 to today
 - B. Heavily modified or non-stock Corvettes (such as Resto-Mods).
 1. These Corvettes will be assigned to the class that is most closely associated with the vehicle's outward appearance, irrespective of its Vehicle ID number. For example, if a vehicle has an aftermarket tube frame, C4 suspension, C5 drivetrain, and a C1 body (aftermarket or original) it will be classified as a C1 because it looks like a C1.
 2. Any questions regarding a vehicle's classification will be resolved by the event co-chairs and the Club board of directors. That decision will be final. No appeal will be considered.
- II. Other show categories.
 - A. At its sole discretion, Corvette Annapolis may include additional categories for participant voting during its Fun Shows, for example: Best Exterior, Best Interior, Best Engine Compartment.
 - B. These categories, if used, will be identified and explained at the Show.
- III. Corvette Annapolis reserves the right to make changes to this guide at any time. This guide will be available on the Club web site for show participants to review prior to any show.
